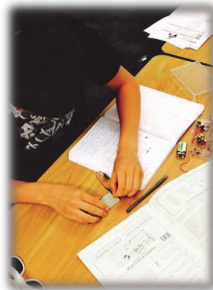

**Who is Eligible?** Summer Session is open to incoming 9<sup>th</sup> graders through non-graduated seniors.

**Times:** Summer session programs will run from 8AM to 3PM daily. There will be a 30 minute lunch each day.

**Cost:** Free! There is no cost for summer session except for possible small fees such as food handlers cards, etc.

**Lunch:** The Mount Vernon School District will be able to provide the Simplified Summer Feeding Program for Children at the Main Campus. Breakfast & Lunch Served Daily Monday through Friday. Meals will be made available at no charge to children 18 years of age and younger. Other students will need to bring their lunch daily as there are no vending machines on campuses.

**Credit:** Students can earn a semester (0.5) high school occupational education credit for successful completion of a summer session class. Students taking the Family/High School Health course will earn a semester (0.5) high school health credit. Attendance is mandatory to receive credit. For extenuating circumstance regarding attendance, please connect with the Director regarding credit.

### **Special Assistance:**

NCTA needs to be advised in advance of the start of summer session regarding students requiring special assistance such as one-to-one educational aides, IEP accommodation, 504 accommodation, etc. If a student requires specific accommodation during the regular school year, the same accommodation is required during summer session. NCTA will coordinate accommodation needs with the student's sending district.
